Metro Vancouver Watermain on 148 Street

Discussion of a point from the communication from Metro Vancouver's Steve Billington Metro Vancouver Community Liaison May 24, 2018:

3. GTHS is concerned that the proposed trench could affect the water table of the Green Timbers Urban Forest. Would ,MV consider installing trench dams to reduce any effect of the buried trench (post construction) acting as a drain?

MV, with its consultant, will review the risk of affecting the water table along the boundary of Green Timbers Urban Forest. Trench dams will be installed if it is determined that MV work will affect the water table of the Green Timbers Urban Forest.

One member noticed this effect with the development of Bose park, from 2015-2016, at the 62 Ave curve at 164 Street. There's concern over "Edge effects". BCIT and UBC forestry management studies may have more information on the subject. Is there more to the story? Don to follow up with Robin Landucci, Surrey's director of forests

Surrey Nature Centre - Update

Good Afternoon, We wanted to take this opportunity to thank you for your involvement in the consultation of the development of the Surrey Nature Centre's Plaza and Parking Lot and update you on the process.

We have been working on revising the Conceptual Plan initially proposed in 2009 since March of this year. Given the feedback we have received from special interest groups and our staff, we are hoping that we are now at a point that we can proceed with detailed design. Please see the attached plan, we would be interested hearing your feedback.

Key considerations which came through during consultation are:

- * Providing a healthy balance between the parking lot, the plaza and programming space.
 - o The overall number of parking spots will not be increasing; however, arrangements will be made so that spots will no longer be leased on a monthly basis. Thereby providing for a net gain.
 - o The dedicated drop off and bus parking will provide for a safe environment for park users during the week and during special events the drop off area may act as an extension of the plaza.
 - o The multiple meeting areas provide the opportunity to run concurrent outdoor programming in the plaza.

- * Providing an accessible, welcoming and inclusive space for users.
 - o Accessible spots have been brought closer to the building to ensure that users of all ages and abilities are able to utilize the facilities.
 - o Additional planting opportunities will be developed during the detailed design stage to soften the Plaza.
 - o We are currently working with local First Nations groups to explore programming opportunities.

- * Provide a stronger identity for the Nature Centre from the street.
 - o Having a unified entrance and exit provides for a stronger threshold when entering the site.
 - o In reducing the overall size of the parking lot to the East we are able to provide more planting opportunities which will create a consistent look and feel along street for the Nature Centre.

- * Ensuring that we retain as many of the existing trees on site as possible.
 - o Currently we are showing the removal of 12 trees and the planting of an additional 70. Of the 12 trees shown for removal, 3 have been identified by our Urban Forestry Group as key specimens which will need to be retained. As such we are planning on working through the retention of these trees in detailed design.
 - o In reducing the overall size of the Eastern parking lot we have been able to provide for the expansion of the forest edge to the South, creating a buffer for the outdoor classroom and significant trees situated along this edge.
 - o As we move forward with the planting of additional trees on site it has been noted by our Urban Forestry section that they would like to see the planting of unusual and significant specimens. If you have suggestions, please let us know.

As mentioned during the consultation process we will be presenting this plan to the public tomorrow at the Nature Centre's 10th Anniversary from 11-4pm, we will have staff on hand to answer any questions. If you are unable to attend please contact myself at your convenience over the next few weeks with your comments.

Hey everyone, As a partner in environmental stewardship education, we value your support in promoting messages that benefit our natural areas. We've noticed an uptick in reports of people harvesting vegetation in our parks - most recently in Sunnyside Acres Urban Forest.

Could you please help us get a reminder out that the harvesting of vegetation in Surrey parks is prohibited by bylaw 13480, including:

- * Berries
- * Conks
- * Mushrooms
- * Fiddleheads
- * Moss

Removing vegetation reduces food sources for native wildlife, and walking off trail to harvest can also lead to soil compaction, trampling of vegetation, and erosion in our sensitive urban natural areas.

We appreciate your continued partnership and support in circulating this message. Please report any incidents of people harvesting vegetation from Surrey parks to 604-501-5050.
